Requested Action: Rezoning from A, Agricultural and R-2, General Residential to MU-Mixed Use.

Purpose: To allow any Use Permitted in an MU-Mixed Use zoned district.

Existing Zoning: R-2, General Residential, and A, Agricultural.

Location: 18th Civil District; Parcel 1.00 (Part), Franklin County, TN Property Map No. 69; Parcels 15.00, 16.00, 17.00, 18.00, 19.00, 19.01, 21.00, 26.00, 27.00, and 28.00, Franklin County, TN Property Map No. 69K "A"; Parcels 13.00, 13.01, 14.00, 15.00, 16.00, 17.00, 18.00, and 43.00, Franklin County, TN Property Map No. 69F "A";; Boundary includes U.S. Highway 41-A, Kentucky Avenue, Castleberry Drive, Ball Park Road, Mimosa Circle, and Sherwood Road.

Size: 53.10 acres +/- per survey.

Existing Land Use: Residential, Educational, and Religious.

Surrounding Land Use and Zoning:

North - Residential, Educational, Wooded, and MU-Mixed Use.

South - Residential, Wooded, and R-2, General Residential, A, Agricultural.

East - Residential, Commercial, Wooded, and MU-Mixed Use.

West - Residential, Wooded, Sewanee Utility District, and R-2, General Residential, A, Agricultural.

Applicable Regulations: Franklin County Zoning Resolution – Article VI, Section 2 (Page 38); Article X, Section 3 (Page 80); Article VII, Section 1 (Page 56); and Article XV (Page 117).

Specific Information

- Specific Activity:** To allow continued development and adaptive reuse of existing structures, and create a walkable, Mixed-Use village in downtown Sewanee.
- Previous Action:** A portion of the subject area was zoned R-2, General Residential with the adoption of Zoning in 1974. The first MU-Mixed Use area, on the properties of the University of the South was approved in 2007. A second area was approved in 2010, a third area approved in 2013, and a fourth area approved in July 2016.
- Access:** The subject area is serviced by a TN State Route/US Hwy (US41-A) and various County Roads.
- Utilities:** Potable water is provided by the Sewanee Utility District (SUD). Power is available to the area and is provided by the Duck River Electric Membership Corporation. Sanitary sewer services are provided in the area by the Sewanee Utility District (SUD).
- Fire Protection:** Fire protection service is provided by the Sewanee Volunteer Fire Department. There are several fire hydrants located within the specified area.
- Other Public Services:** Police protection is provided by the Sewanee Police Department.
- Drainage/Flood:** The site is not in an identified FEMA flood hazard area per Map No. 47051C-0200E.
- Area Characteristics:** The immediate area is characterized by a mix of commercial, residential, and religious activities. The general area encompasses educational/religious facilities and activities of the University of the South; and includes some of the higher density commercial and residential activities.
- Planning Jurisdiction:** The site is located in the Franklin County Regional Planning Commission's jurisdiction.
- Field Survey:** 9-15-16.

Analysis

Staff recommends rezoning of the specified area as requested from R-2, General Residential and A, Agricultural to MU-Mixed Use.

1. The proposal is generally in compliance with the intent of the MU-Mixed Use zoning district provisions of the Franklin County Zoning Resolution.

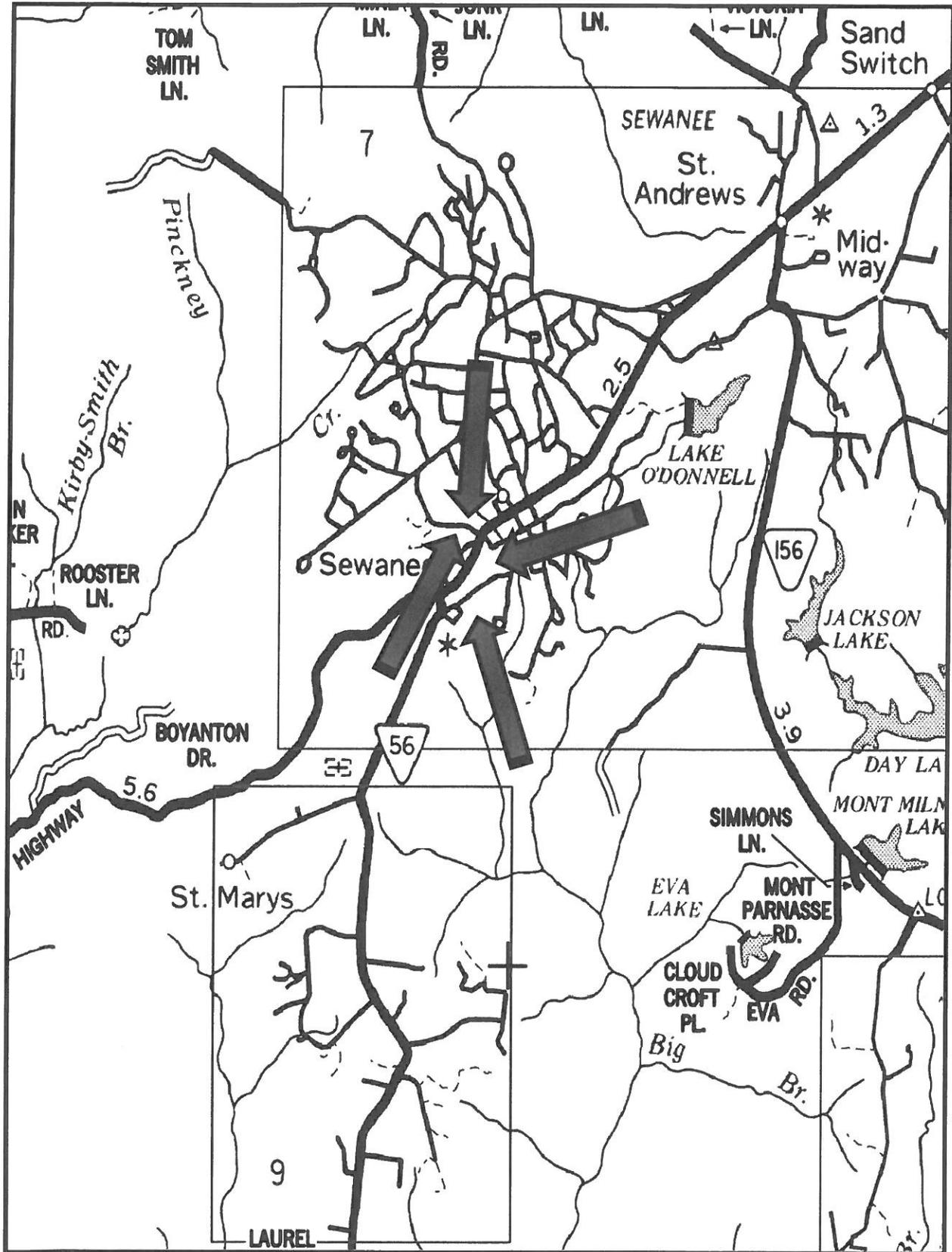

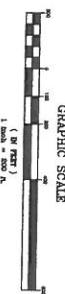

The Franklin County Regional Planning Commission Recommends The Following Amendments To The Zoning Resolution:

Items two (2) through four (4)

The Franklin County Regional Planning Commission recommended the following amendments to the Franklin County Zoning Resolution on 9-27-16:

Article III – Definition of Terms

Add New Definition:

Cottage Court: A configuration of between six (6) to twelve (12) detached and/or attached single-family dwellings, each on their own lot, with each lot abutting onto a common open space which is oriented perpendicular to the adjacent public thoroughfare, with one side of the common open space abutting the thoroughfare and three sides abutting the lots which comprise the Cottage Court. Access to each lot is provided by way of a shared perpetual access easement, in accordance with provisions set forth in Article IV, Section 2.3.

Article IV – General Provisions; Section 2.3

Change From:

2.3 With the exception of Mixed Use Districts, no building shall be erected on a lot which does not abut at least one road which has been accepted as a public thoroughfare for at least thirty (30) feet or to a lot with an easement of at least thirty (30) feet in width to a road which has been accepted as a public thoroughfare. In Mixed Use Districts, no building shall be erected on a lot which does not abut at least one road which has been accepted as a public thoroughfare for at least eighteen (18) feet or to a lot with an easement of at least eighteen (18) feet in width to a road which has been accepted as a public thoroughfare. In case of lots having easements to an accepted public thoroughfare, no more than three (3) lots will be allowed to share all or any part of their easement with other lots. [To allow up to three lots to share easements (four lots, including the parent parcel with road frontage)].

To:

2.3 With the Exception of Mixed Use Districts, no building shall be erected on a lot which does not abut for at least thirty (30) feet; either (1) at least one road which has been accepted as a public thoroughfare; or (2) a perpetual easement of a least thirty (30) feet in width to a road which has been accepted as a public thoroughfare. In case of lots having an access easement to an accepted thoroughfare, no more than four lots may share access, including the lot abutting the public thoroughfare.

In Mixed Use Districts, no building shall be erected on a lot which does not abut for at least eighteen (18) feet; either (1) at least one road which has been accepted as a public thoroughfare; or (2) a perpetual easement of at least eighteen (18) feet in width to a road which has been accepted as a public thoroughfare. In case of lots having an access easement to an accepted thoroughfare, no more than four lots may share access, including the lot abutting the public thoroughfare; with the exception of lots in a Cottage Court configuration, where between six (6) and twelve (12) lots may share access.

Article VII – Provisions Governing Mixed Use Districts; Section 1.1

Add to Section 1.1 Uses Permitted.

1.1(27) Cottage Court, in accordance with provisions set forth in Sections 1.4, 1.5, and 1.6 of this Article, and Article IV, Section 2.3.

The Franklin County Regional Planning Commission – September 27, 2016.

The Franklin County Regional Planning Commission met in a regular session on September 27, 2016 at 6:00 PM in the Franklin County Courthouse.

The members present were Chairman A.L. Shasteen, Secretary Eddie Clark, Vice Secretary David James, John Woodall, Steve Dixon, and Jeremy Price. Also present was Planning and Zoning Director/Building Commissioner Janet Petrunich. A Visitors' List is attached.

The minutes for the August 30, 2016 meeting were approved as written on a motion by Eddie Clark, seconded by David James. All aye.

A.L. Shasteen presented Case No. 10-16; Rezoning; Applicant: Frank Gladu, Agent for the University of the South. Location – 18th Civil District; Parcel 1.00 (Part), Franklin County, TN Property Map No. 69; Parcels 15.00, 16.00, 17.00, 18.00, 19.00, 19.01, 21.00, 26.00, 27.00, and 28.00, Franklin County, TN Property Map No. 69K “A”; Parcels 13.00, 13.01, 14.00, 15.00, 16.00, 17.00, 18.00, and 43.00, Franklin County, TN Property Map No. 69F “A”; Boundary includes U.S. Highway 41-A, Kentucky Avenue, Castleberry Drive, Ball Park Road, Mimosa Circle, and Sherwood Road. Janet Petrunich read the Staff Report. A.L. Shasteen addressed the audience, describing the procedures and protocol of the meeting. A.L. Shasteen asked for any questions from the board members. There were no questions from the board members. A.L. Shasteen asked for any questions from the audience. Charles Whitmer, leaseholder of property proposed to be rezoned, read a lengthy statement in regards to his lease agreement with the University of the South and his discontent with changes made to the size of his leasehold. Whitmer also stated his opposition to the rezoning and asked that the Board deny or at least postpone the rezoning until previously requested changes in the policies of the lease agreements were addressed by the University of the South. A.L. Shasteen offered that the policies/terms of the lease agreement are between the leaseholder and the University, that the county is not involved in those agreements. Frank Gladu stated that they were seeking the rezoning to uniform the zoning in the downtown area. Steve Dixon made a motion to recommend the rezoning as requested from A, Agricultural and R-2, General Residential to MU-Mixed Use to the County Commission for approval, based upon the recommendation of the Staff Report. David James seconded the motion. All aye.

A.L. Shasteen offered that if no objection from the board members, the newly proposed amendments and the proposed amendments under Old Business would be presented together. There was no objection from the board members. Becky Timmons, Director of Implementation for Town Planning & Urban Design Collaborative, presented a slideshow of the proposed “cottage court” design. Janet Petrunich gave a brief explanation of the requested amendments. Becky Timmons gave a review of the potential locations that could accommodate a cottage court and stated that the reason for

presenting this exhibit was to show that they were not intending on building court after court after court along one of the roads, that they are very specific locations and could be as many as three or as few as one. Timmons pointed out how the cottage court would work; easement would front the thoroughfare and access each lot; parking and garages would be at the front of the lots with the houses facing towards the common open space in the center of the court; setbacks and how the front setback is determined by the location of the access (easement). Charles Whitmer stated that he loved the cottage courts, he just wished that they weren't going to be right next to his house. Janet Petrunich offered a couple of changes to the proposed amendments. Janet Petrunich also stated that if the "cottage court" amendment was approved that they would need to take a look at the Subdivision Regulations and make the appropriate amendments. John Woodall questioned Frank Gladu as to who was going to be responsible for the roads in the cottage courts. Frank Gladu offered that it wouldn't be the county. Eddie Clark offered that it wouldn't be a road because the proposed amendment would allow for an easement. Janet Petrunich offered that if the proposed amendments were approved by the County Commission an amendment to the Subdivision Regulations addressing "cottage courts" would be necessary. John Woodall agreed. A.L. Shasteen offered that the proposed amendments would have to go to the County Commission for approval. Janet Petrunich agreed that any proposed amendment to the Zoning Resolution had to be presented to the County Commission for approval however, proposed amendments to the Subdivision Regulations did not. John Woodall made a motion to recommend the proposed amendments with the changes offered by Staff (see attached) to the County Commission for approval. David James seconded the motion. All aye.

The meeting adjourned at 6:35PM by Chairman A.L. Shasteen.

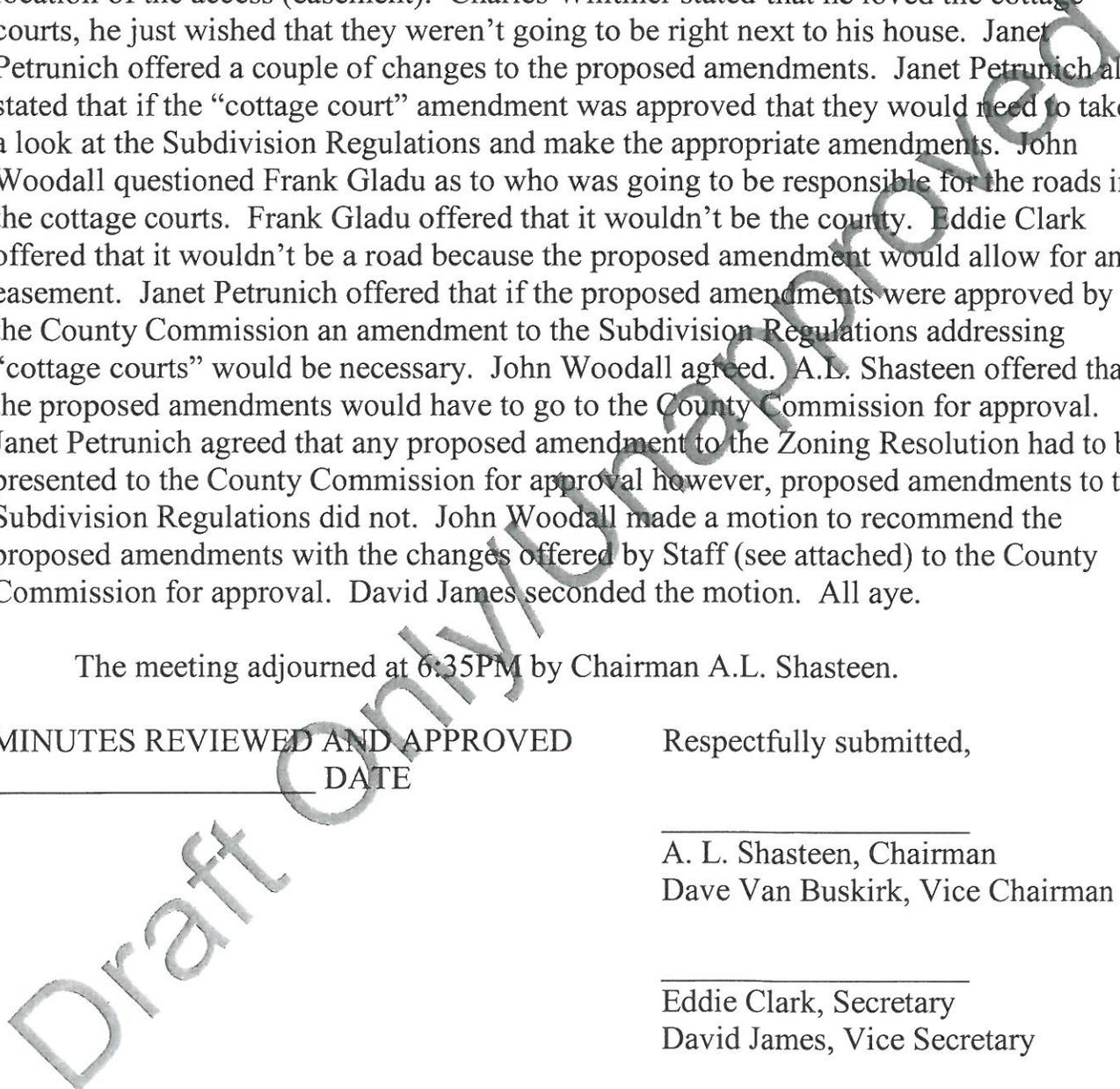

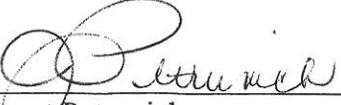

Franklin County Solid Waste

1st Quarter Report FY 2016-2017

- The State of TN, specifically the Department of Environment and Conservation is actively seeking ways to increase their funding toward implementing their controversial 2015-2025 plan. TDEC representatives are wanting to increase their surcharge per ton of waste deposited in the landfill. This charge is already at .90 cents per ton. Currently Franklin County pays \$48.65 / ton to dispose of its waste. Annually, our cost to dispose of waste is a half million dollars. Please reach out to your representatives and let them know that an increase to the TDEC surcharge could create a financial burden on the tax payers of Franklin County.
- Golder and Associates has completed their six month waste study for Franklin County and has advised the Solid Waste Board on their ideas for the way forward for Franklin County in the waste business.
- FCSW has applied for two grants valued at over \$50,000 worth of used-oil and recycling equipment. The grants will be awarded in January of 2017. One of the grants with the highest price tag is very competitive. With our more than triple the diversion rate during FY 2015 we are certain that we will be in the top running for the money.
- We will begin winter hours starting 11/07/2016. This has been a very successful savings of electricity with only a couple of complaints. Last year we saved approximately 2,000.00 in electric bills by closing early. It is safer for the public and our workers by not operating during low-light conditions.
- Our new baler should be in place and operational by the middle of December. This will more than double our recycling processing efforts. As of current we have over 280 six cubic yard bins located across Franklin County capturing cardboard from businesses.

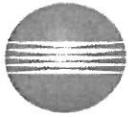

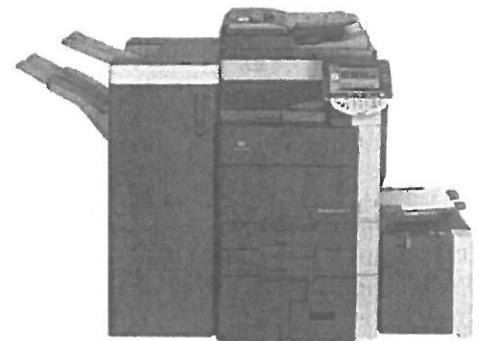
