### **General Information**

Applicant: Clifton Miller.

Requested Action: Rezoning a portion of a parcel from A, Agricultural to I-1, Industrial

District, Special.

Purpose: To allow the expansion to quarry and mine rock and/or any other use

permitted in an I-1, Industrial Zoned District.

Existing Zoning: A, Agricultural.

Location: 10th Civil District; Parcel 22.01 (part), Franklin County, TN Property Map

No. 47, located on Greenhaw Road.

Size: Approximately 15.05 +/- acres. Existing Land Use: Open, Residential.

Surrounding Land Use/Zoning:

North – Residential, Agricultural and Wooded/Agricultural.

South - Wooded, Residential/A, Agricultural.

East - Wooded, Mountain side/A, Agricultural.

West - Agricultural, Residential, Open/A, Agricultural.

## **Specific Information**

Previous Actions: This parcel was zoned A, Agricultural with the adoption of Zoning

in 1974. In 2008 an application was made to rezone this parcel and

parcel 21.00 directly to the north. In 2010 parcel 21.00 was absorbed into parcel 22.01. On February 28, 2017 the Franklin

County Regional Planning Commission made a favorable recommendation to rezone a portion of this parcel from A,

Agricultural to I-1, Industrial District, Special, the Franklin County Board of Commissioners voted to rezone a portion of the parcel on April 15, 2019. On July 18, 2019 the Franklin County Board of Zoning Appeals approved a request for a Use Permitted on Appeal to allow the applicant to mine, quarry, extract and crush rock in an

I-1, Industrial District, Special zoned district.

Access: The parcel fronts Greenhaw Road for approximately five-hundred and fifty

(550) feet. Greenhaw Road is a County Road with a fifty (50) foot ROW and

Asphalt surface.

Utilities A four (4) inch water line runs along the east side of Greenhaw Road according to Travis Stephens, Maintenance Supervisor for Decherd Water. Potable water is supplied by Decherd Water Department. Power is provided by the Duck River Electric Membership Corporation.

Fire Protection: Fire protection service is provided by the Alto/Oak Grove Volunteer Fire Department. There are no fire hydrants in the general area.

Other Public Services: Police protection is provided by the Franklin County Sheriff's Department.

Drainage/Flood: Drainage is generalized to the northwest. There does not appear to be any low lying or ponding areas according to the USGS Quad Map.

The site is not in an identified FEMA flood hazard area per Map No. 47051C0160E.

Area Characteristics: The immediate area is characterized by agricultural and forestry activities, with residential activities along the roadways. The general area is characterized by agricultural and residential activities along the roadways with forestry beyond.

Comprehensive Growth Plan: The site is located within the Franklin County Rural Area (RA).

#### **Applicable Regulations**

Franklin County Zoning Resolution - Article IX Section 2 (page 68); Article X, Section 3 (page 80).

#### Analysis

Staff recommends the requested rezoning of the subject parcel from A, Agricultural to I-1, Industrial District, Special.

- 2. There is I-1, Industrial District, Special on the parcel currently.



## The Franklin County Regional Planning Commission – January 28, 2025.

The Franklin County Regional Planning Commission met in a regular session on January 28, 2025 in the Franklin County Courthouse. The meeting started at 6:00PM with a quorum present.

The members present were Chairman Jeremy Price, Eddie Vincent, Luke McCurry, Helen Tinnerman, Kevin Pickett, Mike Stubblefield and Mayor Chris Guess. Also present was Director/Building Commissioner Eric Bradford and Planning Assistant Jessica King. A Visitors' List is attached.

Chairman Jeremy Price introduced himself and gave a brief explanation of the meeting procedures and all the information that is considered when cases come before the board.

The minutes for the November 26, 2024 meeting were approved as written by Jeremy Price.

Jeremy Price introduced Case No. 01-25; Rezoning; Applicant: William Crenshaw, agent for Joshua Watts, owner. Location – 2nd Civil District; Parcel 28.00, Franklin County, TN Property Map No. 73, located on Six Mile Board Road. Eric Bradford read the Staff Report, and all returned adjoining property owner notices. Price polled the board members for questions or comments. With no questions or comments from the board. Price turned the meeting over to the members of the audience to voice any questions, concerns or comments. Matthew Parks, adjoining property owner raised concerns about deforestation, traffic and disruption to wetlands. Some discussion was held on water available to the site. The audience was reminded that those issues would be looked at when a proposed Preliminary Final Subdivision Plat Review comes before the Board. With everyone in the audience having a turn to speak, Price brought the discussion back to the board. Luke McCurry made a motion to not to recommend the rezoning to the Franklin County Commission based upon discussion and the Staff Report, Kevin Pickett seconded the motion. All aye.

Jeremy Price introduced Case No. 02-25; Rezoning; Applicant: William Crenshaw, agent for Joshua Watts, owner. Location – 2nd Civil District; Parcel 29.00, Franklin County, TN Property Map No. 73, located on Six Mile Board Road and Lynchburg Road. Eric Bradford read the Staff Report, and all returned adjoining property owner notices. Price polled the board members for questions or comments. With no questions or comments from the board. Price turned the meeting over to the members of the audience to voice any questions, concerns or comments. With everyone in the audience having a turn to speak, Price brought the discussion back to the board. Luke McCurry made a motion to not to recommend the rezoning to the Franklin County Commission based upon discussion and the Staff Report, Kevin Pickett seconded the motion. All aye.

Jeremy Price introduced Case No. 03-25; Preliminary Subdivision Plat Review; Applicant: Rex Sparks, agent for Great Lakes Builders LLC. Location – 8th Civil District; Parcel 22.02, Franklin County, TN Property Map No. 12, located on both Jess Duncan Lane and Duncantown Road. Eric Bradford read the Staff Report, and all returned adjoining property owner notices. Price polled the board members for questions or comments. Price asked for clarification on condition #1, King explained some of those lots had been sold and the plat needed to reflect that. There were no additional questions or comments from the board or audience. Eric Bradford took a moment to explain his findings during the recent Site Visit during a raining day to the property and how most of the water ran off to one home more so than others. Eddie Vincent made a motion to approve the Preliminary Subdivision Plat for The Meadows Subdivision based upon the Staff Report, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. A drainage plan which the planning commission may require profiles and typical cross-section of easements, tiles and catch basins.
- 2. Install a fire hydrant if there is adequate flow and pressure to serve the development. If not, provide a letter from the utility company stating such.

Helen Tinnerman seconded the motion. All aye.

Jeremy Price introduced Case No. 04-25; Rezoning; Applicant: Clifton Miller, agent for Tinsley Asphalt, owner. Location – 10th Civil District; Parcel 22.01, Franklin County, TN Property Map No. 47, located on Greenhaw Road. Eric Bradford read the Staff Report, and all returned adjoining property owner notices. Price polled the board members for questions or comments. With no questions or comments from the board. Price turned the meeting over to the members of the audience to voice any questions, concerns or comments. Neal Merrett, adjoining property owner, led a discussion on truck traffic, road wear and tear and noise pollution. Clifton Miller, representative for Tinsley Asphalt, answered most of the questions posed. Kim Cunningham, adjoining property owner, asked how many employees they anticipated would work at the proposed facility, Miller stated they anticipated about twenty-four would work on site. Some discussion was held on the current cemetery and how it would be maintained. Miller answered that they have fenced off the cemetery and would maintain an access road for it. With everyone in the audience having a turn to speak, Price brought the discussion back to the board. Luke McCurry made a motion to recommend the rezoning to the Franklin County Commission based upon discussion and the Staff Report, Eddie Vincent seconded the motion. Helen Tinnerman opposed but all other members voted aye.

Jeremy Price introduced Case No. 05-25; Preliminary/Final Subdivision Plat Review; Applicant Sandra Jenkins, agent for Ritchie Reese, owner. Location – 3rd Civil District; Parcel 32.01, Franklin County, TN Property Map No. 82, located on Sugartree Springs Road. Eric Bradford read the Staff Report and any returned adjoining property owner notices. Price polled the board members for questions or comments, everyone having a turn to speak. Price turned the meeting over the audience to voice any questions, concerns or comments they may have. All members of the audience having a turn to speak, Price returned the discussion to the board. With no further discussion Price called for a motion. Eddie Vincent made a motion to approve the Preliminary/Final Subdivision Plat for Old Salem Lexie Subdivision based upon discussion and the Staff Report, subject to the following conditions:

- Correct property owner and deed reference.
- Correct waterline size.
- 3. A drainage plan which the planning commission may require profiles and typical cross-section of easements, tiles and catch basins.
- 4. Install a fire hydrant if there is adequate flow and pressure to serve the development. If not, provide a letter from the utility company stating such.
- Certificate of approval for subdivisions and street name(s) be added and signed.
- 6. Show lot 6 to have adequate building area suitable for a single-family residence, if not combine it with another lot to allow the best use of the land.

#### **Debt Management Policy**

#### Franklin County, Tennessee

Formally Adopted <u>December 5, 201</u>
Revised December 3, 2012, April 15, 2013 & January 21, 2020

**Goal/Mission:** To provide management with appropriate guidelines and direction to assist in making sound debt management decisions. To further demonstrate strong financial management practices for our county citizens, outside investors, and credit agencies.

#### **Objectives:**

- 1. Enhance decision process transparency and identify all expenditures of principal, interest, and annual costs along with issue specific transaction costs
- 2. Address hiring outside professionals
- 3. Address any potential conflict of interest issues
- 4. Additional requirements for new debt

#### 1. Enhance transparency of decisions by way of Annual Debt Report, Annual Budgets, and Specific New Issue Report

Responsibilities for analysis and reporting shall be with the Finance Director & County Mayor.

To insure transparency of decisions, an annual debt payment reports and annual debt service budgets, as well as specific issuance debt reports (i.e. those required by state law) shall be prepared and available for public review and comment. County officials will comply with State of Tennessee Open Record laws and respond to record requests from any citizen of Tennessee promptly.

#### **Annual Debt Report**

An annual debt payment report shall be submitted to the county legislative body each year. The report will be presented with the annual debt budget.

The annual report shall consist of but not be limited to:

- Budget summary and detailed budget as required by the Comptroller's office.
- Net Debt Calculation (Total Principal outstanding less most recent year respective debt fund balance).
- Calculation of Net Debt per capita from last official census (net debt/population).
- Documentation of the most recent debt rating.
- Reports will reflect estimated fund balance

#### **Annual Debt Budgets**

Annual Debt Budgets shall be adopted by the county legislative body and comply with legal notice and filings requirements per the Franklin County, Tennessee and State Open Records Law.

#### **New Debt Issuance**

Unless specifically disallowed by this policy, the County authorizes the use of all types of debt permitted by applicable Tennessee state statutes so long as such debt is issued in full compliance with applicable Tennessee state statutes and regulations implemented by the State Funding Board and so long as such debt is specifically authorized by resolution duly adopted by the County Commission. Types of debt authorized include, but are not necessarily limited to:

- a. General obligation bonds, notes and loan agreements
- b. Revenue bonds, notes and loan agreements
- c. Revenue and tax bonds, notes and loan agreements
- d. Interfund loans
- e. Leases

The County authorizes the issuance of debt by both competitive sale and by negotiated sale as permitted by and in full compliance with applicable Tennessee state statutes.

The County authorizes the use of debt to finance capital projects, to refinance existing debt, or address temporary cash flow deficiencies (tax anticipation notes, revenue anticipation notes and interfund loans) all as permitted by and in full compliance with applicable Tennessee state statutes.

Any new <u>material</u> debt issuance shall comply with State Form CT-0253 as well as any other state required forms that detail all associated costs for the issuance of the debt. Also, any new <u>material</u> debt issuance shall comply with Federal Form 8038 as well as any other federally required forms that detail all associated costs for the issuance of the debt. These records will be available for public and county commission inspection as prescribed by applicable Tennessee state statutes and regulations implemented by the State Funding Board.

Franklin County does not consider operating leases as material debt issuances as they are paid from allocated annual budgets and are generally small leases for copiers, postage machines, etc., that span over the maximum of five (5) years. All operating leases are approved by the legislative body prior to contractual obligation. Capital Leases shall be reported to EMMA as compliant with SEC 15c2-12, within the required timeline.

#### 2. Hiring of Professionals for Debt Issuance

- From time to time the county may hire legal counsel, a financial advisor or underwriter to assist in issuance of debt.
- <u>Financial Advisor</u>: The County shall enter into a written agreement with each person or firm serving as financial advisor for debt management and transactions. Whether in a negotiated or competitive sale, the financial advisor shall <u>not</u> be permitted to bid on, privately place or underwrite an issue for which they are providing advisory services for the issuance. The county will utilize the most current definition of "financial advisor", as determined by the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission and the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board, when determining what exactly defines a financial advisor.

- <u>Underwriter</u>: If there is an underwriter, the county shall consider the engagement of an underwriter for a negotiated sale, the County will take the following criteria into account:
  - a. Reputation
  - b. Experience
  - c. Professional qualifications and licenses
  - d. Capital adequacy and financial wherewithal indicting an ability to fulfill financial commitments to the County
  - e. Financing plans, ideas and analysis
  - f. Cost including underwriter's compensation and all other cost associated with a financing transaction

As well the underwriter shall clearly identify itself in writing (e.g. in a response to a request for proposal or in promotional materials provided to the issuer) as an underwriter and not as a financial advisor from the earliest stages of its relationship with the county with respect to that issue. The underwriter must clarify its primary role as a purchaser of securities in an arm's-length commercial transaction and that it has financial and other interests that differ from those of the county's. The underwriter in a publicly offered, negotiated sale shall be required to provide pricing information both as to interest rates and to takedown per maturity to the governing body in advance of the pricing of the debt.

All professionals involved with the cost of issuance of debt shall disclose the estimated
cost of their respective services including "soft" costs or compensations in lieu of direct
payments to the county commission prior to the issuance of the debt.

#### 3. Conflict of Interest Issues

- It is required that all professionals related to the debt issue will enter into a written engagement letter related to their proposed services, cost, and any potential conflict of interest. These letters will be signed by the county mayor and are open records.
- Professionals involved in a debt transaction hired or compensated by the county shall be required to disclose to the county existing client and business relationships between and among the professionals to a transaction (including but not limited to financial advisor,


swap advisor, bond counsel, swap counsel, trustee, paying agent, underwriter, counterparty, and remarketing agent), as well as conduit issuers, sponsoring organizations and program administrators. This disclosure shall include that information reasonably sufficient to allow the county to appreciate the significance of the relationships. No engagement letter is required for any lawyer who is an employee of the county or lawyer or law firm which is under a general appointment or contract to serve as counsel to the county. The county does not need an engagement letter with counsel not representing the county, such as underwriters' counsel.

Professionals who become involved in the debt transaction as a result of a bid submitted
in a widely and publicly advertised competitive sale conducted using an industry
standard, electronic bidding platform are not subject to this disclosure. No disclosure is
required that would violate any rule or regulation of professional conduct.

#### 4. Additional Requirements for New Debt

- All leases will be reviewed by the county attorney prior to execution of the lease, in order to determine if the instrument is a capital or operating lease. No county official that is not authorized by State statute should execute a capital lease on behalf of the county. Since capital leases are typically the least used and most expensive means of financing, the county commission should fully understand the cost of the asset and borrow cost imputed, as well as, whether they intend to use the asset through the end of its useful life.
- In accordance with State statute, no repayment schedule of debt will extend past the
  useful life of the asset that the funds are being issued for. The most current, adopted
  county's capital asset policy will be referenced for asset useful lives.
- If borrowing using capital outlay notes, the county should solicit a minimum of three rate
  and issuance cost quotes and select the lowest and best offer. The county will include
  local banks in their solicitation when available.

- Repayment schedules should use the straight-line method of repayment (debt retirement similar to a conventional home loan).
- When considering bonded debt, the county will compare the proposed repayment schedule with the straight-line method noted and will determine whether the new debt has an advanced repayment schedule, straight-line or back loaded schedule.
- The county commission may utilize variable rate debt in the county's overall debt
  management plan, if at the present time variable rate debt is presented it is the most
  advantageous for Franklin County, Tennessee. The county will maintain a reasonable
  fund balance in the debt service funds to safeguard against interest rate and liquidity
  risks.
- In the case of refinancing, an analysis report shall be provided which fully explains the
  reasons for the refinancing and the net savings and costs of the refinancing which will
  include not only interest charges but also the fees associated with the transaction.
- As approved in the annual Continuing Budget Resolution and the annual Appropriation Resolution, Tax Anticipation Notes (TAN) shall be allowed for, following all prescribed guidelines and regulations of the Tennessee Code Annotated 9-21-801. It shall be the policy of Franklin County to utilize existing county funds for a TAN if possible in order to reduce interest cost.

# FRANKLIN COUNTY GOVERNMENT

## Franklin County Social Media Policy for Employees

## Purpose:

This policy establishes the guidelines for the personal and professional use of social media by employees of Franklin County. It is designed to protect the integrity, reputation, and confidentiality of the local government while encouraging responsible use of social media platforms.

## Scope:

This policy applies to all employees of Franklin County including full-time, part-time, temporary, and contracted employees. It covers the use of social media platforms both during and outside of work hours.

## **Policy Overview:**

Social media is an effective tool for communication and engagement, but it is important to recognize that your actions online can impact both your personal reputation and the reputation of Franklin County. As public employees, there are unique responsibilities and expectations regarding social media use.

## 1. Personal Use of Social Media

While personal social media use is generally permitted during non-work hours, employees must adhere to the following guidelines:

- Be Mindful of Your Public Role: As an employee of Franklin County, you are a representative of the government, even when using social media in a personal capacity. Avoid posting content that could be perceived as reflecting poorly on your position or the local government.
- Respect for Privacy: Do not share confidential or proprietary information regarding the local government, colleagues, or residents. This includes, but is not limited to, internal communications, project details, or any non-public information obtained through your work.
- Avoid Conflicts of Interest: Do not engage in social media activity that could create a conflict of interest. For example, avoid endorsing private businesses or political candidates in a way that could be linked to your employment with the local government.
- Harassment and Discrimination: Employees are expected to follow the same policies regarding harassment and discrimination online as they would in person. Offensive, discriminatory, or harassing behavior on social media will not be tolerated, even on personal accounts.

• Personal Responsibility: If you choose to discuss your job or the local government on social media, make it clear that your views are personal and do not represent the official position of Franklin County. Use disclaimers such as "opinions are my own" to differentiate personal views from official government positions.

## 2. Professional Use of Social Media

For employees with access to official government social media accounts or who use social media as part of their work duties, the following guidelines apply:

- Official Use Only: Employees should only post on official social media accounts if they are authorized to do so. All posts must be accurate, respectful, and in alignment with Franklin County's goals and values.
- Content Approval Process: Posts made on behalf of the local government must be approved by the appropriate department, supervisor, or communications staff to ensure consistency, accuracy, and alignment with public policy.
- Accuracy and Transparency: Only share verified, factual information. Any errors or updates should be corrected promptly. Public trust is essential, and misinformation can damage the reputation of Franklin County.
- Engagement with the Public: When responding to inquiries or comments on official social media platforms, employees should maintain a professional, courteous, and helpful tone. If a comment or inquiry is outside of your department's scope, redirect the individual to the appropriate contact.
- Respect for Intellectual Property: Only share content (e.g., images, videos, articles) for which Franklin County holds rights or has permission to use. Always provide credit for external content.

## 3. Prohibited Use of Social Media

The following actions are prohibited on personal or professional social media platforms:

- **Defamation and Harassment:** Posting discriminatory, offensive, or threatening content aimed at individuals, groups, or entities is prohibited. This includes making negative comments about Franklin County, its employees, or members of the public.
- Posting Confidential or Proprietary Information: Do not share confidential or proprietary government information, including personal data, internal discussions, or unpublished reports.
- Sharing False Information: Deliberate posting of false or misleading information about the local government, employees, or services will result in disciplinary action.

# 4. Privacy and Security

- Maintain Security: Protect your accounts with strong passwords and avoid sharing login credentials with others. Do not access government social media accounts on public computers or networks where security cannot be ensured.
- Respect the Privacy of Others: Avoid sharing personal information about citizens, colleagues, or anyone related to your work. Always adhere to state and federal privacy laws, including the Tennessee Public Records Act.
- Public Records: Social media posts may be subject to public records laws. Employees should be aware that communications on social media related to official business could be

subject to public records requests and should be mindful of this when engaging in discussions related to work.

## 5. Disciplinary Action

Failure to adhere to this policy may result in disciplinary action, up to and including termination. Consequences for violating the policy may vary depending on the severity and nature of the infraction.

# 6. Reporting Concerns

Employees who become aware of a violation of this policy, or if they feel their own social media activity has been misrepresented or exploited, should report the concern to their supervisor or the Human Resources Department.

## 7. Training and Resources

Franklin County will provide training on responsible social media use, including maintaining professionalism online and understanding privacy and public records laws. This training is mandatory for employees with access to government social media accounts.

## Conclusion:

Social media provides valuable opportunities for communication and engagement. However, it also comes with responsibilities. As an employee of Franklin County, you are expected to use social media in a way that upholds the values of professionalism, respect, and transparency, and that does not compromise the reputation of the local government.

By following these guidelines, you will help create a safe, respectful, and effective online environment for both yourself and the community you serve.
