WHEREAS, pursuant to authority granted by Sections 9-21-601, et seq., Tennessee Code Annotated, subject to the approval of the Comptroller of the Treasury or the Comptroller's designee, counties in Tennessee are authorized to issue interest bearing capital outlay notes for all county purposes for which general obligation bonds can be legally authorized and issued for a period of not greater than the end of the twelfth fiscal year following the fiscal year in which the notes are issued; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Tennessee (the "County") has determined that it is necessary and desirable to issue not to exceed \$450,000 in aggregate principal amount of capital outlay notes to provide funds to finance the (i) constructing, improving, repairing, renovating and equipping of public buildings including technology equipment and any related software; (ii) payment of legal, fiscal, administrative, architectural and engineering costs incident thereto (collectively, the "Projects"); and (iii) reimbursement to the appropriate fund of the Municipality for prior expenditures for the foregoing costs, if applicable; and (iv) payment of costs incident to the issuance and sale of such notes; and

WHEREAS, it appears to the Board of County Commissioners of the County that it will be advantageous to the County to issue not to exceed \$450,000 in aggregate principal amount of capital outlay notes for said purposes; and

WHEREAS, it is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners of the County to adopt this resolution for the purpose of authorizing such notes, establishing the terms thereof, providing for the issuance, sale and payment of the notes and disposition of proceeds therefrom, and providing for the levy of a tax for the payment of principal thereof and interest thereon.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Tennessee, as follows:

Section 1. Authority. The notes authorized by this resolution are issued pursuant to Sections 9-21-101 et seq., Tennessee Code Annotated, and other applicable provisions of law.

<u>Section</u> 2. <u>Definitions</u>. The following terms shall have the following meanings in this resolution unless the text expressly or by necessary implication requires otherwise:

- (a) "Code" shall mean the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and all regulations promulgated or proposed thereunder;
 - (b) "County" shall mean Franklin County, Tennessee;
- (c) "Debt Management Policy" shall mean the Debt Management Policy approved by the Governing Body;
 - (d) "Governing Body" shall mean the Board of County Commissioners of the County;

- (e) "Notes" shall mean the not to exceed \$450,000 General Obligation Capital Outlay Notes of the County, to be issued in one or more series, each dated their date of issuance, and have such series designation or such other dated date as shall be determined by the County Mayor, pursuant to Section 8 hereof:
- (f) "Projects" shall mean (i) constructing, improving, repairing, renovating and equipping of public buildings including technology equipment and any related software; and (ii) payment of legal, fiscal, administrative, architectural and engineering costs incident thereto; and
- (g) "Registration Agent" shall mean the Director of Accounts and Budgets who shall serve as registration and paying agent or any successor registration agent and paying agent appointed by the Governing Body.
- Section 3. Findings of the Governing Body; Compliance with Debt Management Policy. The Governing Body hereby finds that the issuance and sale of the Notes, as proposed herein, is consistent with the County's Debt Management Policy.
- Section 4. Authorization and Terms of the Notes. (a) For the purpose of funding the Projects, reimbursing the County for funds previously expended for costs of the Projects, if any, and paying the costs incident to the issuance and sale of the Notes, there are hereby authorized to be issued interest bearing capital outlay notes of the County, in certificated form, in an aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$450,000. Subject to the adjustments permitted in Section 8 hereof, the Notes shall be issued in one or more series, in fully registered form, without coupons, shall be known as "General Obligation Capital Outlay Notes" and shall be dated their date of issuance, and have such series designation or such other dated date as shall be determined by the County Mayor; and shall bear interest at a rate or rates not to exceed the maximum interest rate permitted by applicable Tennessee law, payable, subject to the adjustments permitted pursuant to Section 8 hereof, no less frequently than semi-annually. The Notes shall be issued initially in not less than \$5,000 denominations or integral multiples of \$5,000 in excess thereof, as shall be requested by the original purchaser thereof. Subject to the adjustments permitted by Section 8 hereof, each series of Notes shall mature serially or be subject to mandatory redemption and be payable annually over not more than twelve years, in a manner that produces approximately level debt service throughout the term of the Notes, unless otherwise approved by the Comptroller of the Treasury or the Comptroller's designee.
- (b) Subject to the adjustments permitted by Section 8 hereof, each series of Notes shall be subject to redemption prior to maturity at the option of the County, as a whole or in part, at any time at the redemption price of par plus accrued interest to the redemption date. If less than all of a series of the Notes shall be called for redemption, the maturities to be redeemed shall be designated by the Governing Body, in its discretion, and, if less than all of the Notes of a maturity shall be called for redemption, the Notes within the maturity to be redeemed shall be selected by the Registration Agent by lot or such other random manner as the Registration Agent in its discretion shall determine; provided, however, notwithstanding the foregoing, if any series or portion thereof of the Notes are sold as a Term Note, as defined below, the Governing Body may designate the mandatory redemption payment to be redeemed.
- (c) Pursuant to Section 8 hereof, the County Mayor is authorized to sell the Notes, or any maturities thereof, as term notes ("Term Notes") with mandatory redemption requirements as determined by the County Mayor. In the event any or all the Notes are sold as Term Notes, the County shall redeem Term Notes on redemption dates in aggregate principal amounts equal to the maturity amounts determined by the County Mayor at a price of par plus accrued interest thereon to the date of redemption.

The Term Notes to be redeemed within a single maturity shall be selected in the manner described in subsection (b) above.

At its option, to be exercised on or before the forty-fifth (45th) day next preceding any such mandatory redemption date, the County may (i) deliver to the Registration Agent for cancellation Notes to be redeemed, in any aggregate principal amount desired, and/or (ii) receive a credit in respect of its redemption obligation under this mandatory redemption provision for any Notes of the maturity to be redeemed which prior to said date have been purchased or redeemed (otherwise than through the operation of a mandatory sinking fund redemption provision) and canceled by the Registration Agent and not theretofore applied as a credit against any redemption obligation under this mandatory sinking fund provision. Each Note so delivered or previously purchased or redeemed shall be credited by the Registration Agent at 100% of the principal amount thereof on the obligation of the County on such payment date and any excess shall be credited on future redemption obligations in chronological order, and the principal amount of Notes to be redeemed by operation of this mandatory sinking fund provision shall be accordingly reduced. The County shall on or before the forty-fifth (45th) day next preceding each payment date furnish the Registration Agent with its certificate indicating whether or not and to what extent the provisions of clauses (i) and (ii) of this subsection are to be availed of with respect to such payment and confirm that funds for the balance of the next succeeding prescribed payment will be paid on or before the next succeeding payment date.

- Notice of call for redemption, whether optional or mandatory, shall be given by the Registration Agent on behalf of the County not less than ten (10) nor more than sixty (60) days prior to the date fixed for redemption by sending an appropriate notice to the registered owners of the Notes to be redeemed by first-class mail, postage prepaid, at the addresses shown on the Note registration records of the Registration Agent as of the date of the notice; but neither failure to mail such notice nor any defect in any such notice so mailed shall affect the sufficiency of the proceedings for redemption of any of the Notes for which proper notice was given. This notice may state that it is conditioned upon the deposit of moneys in an amount equal to the amount necessary to affect the redemption with the Registration Agent no later than the redemption date ("Conditional Redemption"). The Registration Agent shall mail said notices as and when directed by the County pursuant to written instructions from an authorized representative of the County (other than for a mandatory sinking fund redemption, notices of which shall be given on the dates determined by the County Mayor) given at least forty-five (45) days prior to the redemption date (unless a shorter notice period shall be satisfactory to the Registration Agent). From and after the redemption date, all Notes called for redemption shall cease to bear interest if funds are available at the office of the Registration Agent for the payment thereof and if notice has been duly provided as set forth herein. In the case of a Conditional Redemption, the failure of the County to make funds available in part or in whole on or before the redemption date shall not constitute an event of default, and the Registration Agent shall give immediate notice to the affected noteholder(s) that the redemption did not occur and that the Notes called for redemption and not so paid remain outstanding.
- (e) The County hereby authorizes and directs the Registration Agent to maintain Note registration records with respect to the Notes, to authenticate and deliver the Notes as provided herein, either at original issuance or upon transfer, to effect transfers of the Notes, to give all notices of redemption as required herein, to make all payments of principal and interest with respect to the Notes as provided herein, to cancel and destroy Notes which have been paid at maturity or upon earlier redemption or submitted for exchange or transfer, to furnish the County at least annually a certificate of destruction with respect to Notes canceled and destroyed, and to furnish the County at least annually an audit confirmation of Notes paid, Notes outstanding and payments made with respect to interest on the Notes.
- (f) The Notes shall be payable, both principal and interest, in lawful money of the United States of America at the main office of the Registration Agent. The Registration Agent shall make all

interest payments with respect to the Notes by check or draft on each interest payment date directly to the registered owners as shown on the Note registration records maintained by the Registration Agent as of the close of business on the fifteenth day of the month next preceding the interest payment date (the "Regular Record Date") by depositing said payment in the United States mail, postage prepaid, addressed to such owners at their addresses shown on said Note registration records, without, except for final payment, the presentation or surrender of such registered Notes, and all such payments shall discharge the obligations of the County in respect of such Notes to the extent of the payments so made. Payment of principal of and premium, if any, on the Notes shall be made upon presentation and surrender of such Notes to the Registration Agent as the same shall become due and payable. All rates of interest specified herein shall be computed on the basis of a three hundred sixty (360) day year composed of twelve (12) months of thirty (30) days each. If requested by the Owner, payment of interest on such Notes shall be paid by wire transfer to a bank within the continental United States and written notice of any such election is given to the Registration Agent prior to the record date.

- Any interest on any Note that is payable but is not punctually paid or duly provided for (g) on any interest payment date (hereinafter "Defaulted Interest") shall forthwith cease to be payable to the registered owner on the relevant Regular Record Date; and, in lieu thereof, such Defaulted Interest shall be paid by the County to the persons in whose names the Notes are registered at the close of business on a date (the "Special Record Date") for the payment of such Defaulted Interest, which shall be fixed in the following manner: the County shall notify the Registration Agent in writing of the amount of Defaulted Interest proposed to be paid on each Note and the date of the proposed payment, and at the same time the County shall deposit with the Registration Agent an amount of money equal to the aggregate amount proposed to be paid in respect of such Defaulted Interest or shall make arrangements satisfactory to the Registration Agent for such deposit prior to the date of the proposed payment, such money when deposited to be held in trust for the benefit of the persons entitled to such Defaulted Interest as in this Section provided. Thereupon, not less than ten (10) days after the receipt by the Registration Agent of the notice of the proposed payment, the Registration Agent shall fix a Special Record Date for the payment of such Defaulted Interest which Date shall be not more than fifteen (15) nor less than ten (10) days prior to the date of the proposed payment to the registered owners. The Registration Agent shall promptly notify the County of such Special Record Date and, in the name and at the expense of the County, not less than ten (10) days prior to such Special Record Date, shall cause notice of the proposed payment of such Defaulted Interest and the Special Record Date therefor to be mailed, first class postage prepaid, to each registered owner at the address thereof as it appears in the Note registration records maintained by the Registration Agent as of the date of such notice. Nothing contained in this Section or in the Notes shall impair any statutory or other rights in law or in equity of any registered owner arising as a result of the failure of the County to punctually pay or duly provide for the payment of principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Notes when due.
- (h) The Notes are transferable only by presentation to the Registration Agent by the registered owner, or his legal representative duly authorized in writing, of the registered Note(s) to be transferred with the form of assignment on the reverse side thereof completed in full and signed with the name of the registered owner as it appears upon the face of the Note(s) accompanied by appropriate documentation necessary to prove the legal capacity of any legal representative of the registered owner. Upon receipt of the Note(s) in such form and with such documentation, if any, the Registration Agent shall issue a new Note or the Note to the assignee(s) in \$5,000 denominations, or integral multiples of \$1,000 in excess thereof, as requested by the registered owner requesting transfer. The Registration Agent shall not be required to transfer or exchange any Note during the period commencing on a Regular or Special Record Date and ending on the corresponding interest payment date of such Note, nor to transfer or exchange any Note after the notice calling such Note for redemption has been made, nor to transfer or exchange any Note during the period following the receipt of instructions from the County to call such Note for redemption; provided, the Registration Agent, at its option, may make transfers after

any of said dates. No charge shall be made to any registered owner for the privilege of transferring any Note, provided that any transfer tax relating to such transaction shall be paid by the registered owner requesting transfer. The person in whose name any Note shall be registered shall be deemed and regarded as the absolute owner thereof for all purposes and neither the County nor the Registration Agent shall be affected by any notice to the contrary whether or not any payments due on the Notes shall be overdue. The Notes, upon surrender to the Registration Agent, may, at the option of the registered owner, be exchanged for an equal aggregate principal amount of the Notes of the same maturity in any authorized denomination or denominations.

- (i) The Notes shall be executed in such manner as may be prescribed by applicable law, in the name, and on behalf, of the County with the manual or facsimile signature of the County Mayor and with the official seal, or a facsimile thereof, of the County impressed or imprinted thereon and attested by the manual or facsimile signature of the County Clerk.
- (j) The Registration Agent is hereby authorized to authenticate and deliver the Notes to the original purchaser, upon receipt by the County of the proceeds of the sale thereof and to authenticate and deliver Notes in exchange for Notes of the same principal amount delivered for transfer upon receipt of the Note(s) to be transferred in proper form with proper documentation as hereinabove described. The Notes shall not be valid for any purpose unless authenticated by the Registration Agent on the certificate set forth herein on the Note form.
- (k) In case any Note shall become mutilated, or be lost, stolen, or destroyed, the County, in its discretion, shall issue, and the Registration Agent, upon written direction from the County, shall authenticate and deliver, a new Note of like tenor, amount, maturity and date, in exchange and substitution for, and upon the cancellation of, the mutilated Note, or in lieu of and in substitution for such lost, stolen or destroyed Note, or if any such Note shall have matured or shall be about to mature, instead of issuing a substituted Note the County may pay or authorize payment of such Note without surrender thereof. In every case the applicant shall furnish evidence satisfactory to the County and the Registration Agent of the destruction, theft or loss of such Note, and indemnity satisfactory to the County and the Registration Agent; and the County may charge the applicant for the issue of such new Note an amount sufficient to reimburse the County for the expense incurred by it in the issue thereof.
- Section 5. Source of Payment. The Notes shall be payable from unlimited ad valorem taxes to be levied on all taxable property within the County. For the prompt payment of principal of and interest on the Notes, the full faith and credit of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged.
- <u>Section</u> 6. <u>Form of Notes</u>. The Notes shall be in substantially the following form, the omissions to be appropriately completed when the Notes are prepared and delivered:

Principal and interest falling due at any time when there are insufficient funds from this tax levy on hand shall be paid from the current funds of the County and reimbursement therefor shall be made out of the taxes hereby provided to be levied when the same shall have been collected. The tax herein provided may be reduced to the extent of direct appropriations from the general funds or other legally available funds of the County to the payment of debt service on the Notes.

<u>Section</u> 8. <u>Sale of Notes</u>. (a) The Notes shall be offered for public sale, pursuant to an informal bid process or by competitive public sale, in each case as required by law, at a price of not less than par, as a whole or in part from time to time as shall be determined by the County Mayor, in consultation with Stephens Inc., Nashville, Tennessee, the County's municipal advisor (the "Municipal Advisor").

- (b) If the Notes are sold in more than one series, the County Mayor is authorized to designate each series, to cause to be sold in each series an aggregate principal amount of Notes less than that shown in Section 4 hereof, and to make corresponding adjustments to the maturity schedule of each series, so long as the total aggregate principal amount of all series issued does not exceed the total aggregate principal amount of Notes authorized to be issued herein.
- (c) The County Mayor is authorized (i) to change the dated date of the Notes to a date other than their date of issuance; (ii) to designate the series of the Notes; (iii) to establish the interest payment dates on the Notes provided that the first interest payment date is not later than twelve (12) months from the dated date of the Notes; (iv) to establish the principal payment dates and maturity amounts of the Notes, provided that (A) the total principal amount of all series of the Notes does not exceed the total amount of Notes authorized herein, (B) the final maturity date of each series shall not exceed the end of the twelfth fiscal year following the fiscal year in which the Notes are issued; and (C) such maturity schedule is approved by the Comptroller of the Treasury or the Comptroller's designee, if required; (vi) to sell less than the authorized principal amount of Notes authorized herein; and (vii) to sell the Notes, or any series thereof, or any maturities thereof as Term Notes with mandatory redemption requirements corresponding to the maturities determined by the County Mayor, as he shall deem most advantageous to the County.
- (d) The County Mayor is authorized to sell the Notes, or any series thereof, simultaneously with any other bonds or notes authorized by resolution or resolutions of the Governing Body. The County Mayor is further authorized to sell the Notes, or any series thereof, as a single issue of notes with any other general obligation capital outlay notes with substantially similar terms authorized by resolution

or resolutions of the Governing Body, in one or more series as he shall deem to be advantageous to the County; provided, however, that the total aggregate principal amount of combined notes to be sold does not exceed the total aggregate principal amount of Notes authorized by this resolution or notes authorized by any other resolution or resolutions adopted by the Governing Body.

- (e) The County Mayor is authorized to award the Notes, or any series thereof, to the bidder whose bid results in the lowest true interest cost to the County, as determined by the County Mayor, provided the rate or rates on the Notes does not exceed the maximum rate permitted by applicable Tennessee law at the time of the issuance of the Notes or any series thereof. The sale of each series of the Notes by the County Mayor shall be binding on the County, and no further action of the Governing Body with respect thereto shall be required. The form of the Note set forth in Section 6 hereof, shall be conformed to reflect any changes made pursuant to this Section 8 hereof.
- (f) The County Mayor and County Clerk, or either of them, are authorized to cause the Notes to be authenticated and delivered by the Registration Agent to the original purchaser and to execute, publish, and deliver all certificates and documents, including an official statement or offering circular and closing certificates, as they shall deem necessary in connection with the sale and delivery of the Notes.
- (g) The County Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with the Municipal Advisor, for financial advisory services in connection with the sale of the Notes and to enter into a contract with Bass, Berry & Sims PLC to serve as bond counsel in connection with the Notes.
- (h) No series of Notes shall be issued until after the approval of the Comptroller of the Treasury or the Comptroller's designee shall have been obtained as required by Sections 9-21-101 et seq., Tennessee Code Annotated. If the amortization schedule of any series of Notes does not reflect annual level debt service payments, then the County Mayor shall request waiver of the periodic retirement requirement.
- Section 9. Disposition of Note Proceeds. The proceeds of the sale of each series of the Notes shall be paid to the County Trustee to be deposited with a financial institution regulated by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or similar or successor federal agency in a special fund known as the General Obligation Note Fund (the "Note Fund") with a designation that includes the year in which such series of Notes is issued to be kept separate and apart from all other funds of the County. The County shall disburse funds in the Note Fund to pay costs of issuance of the Notes, including necessary legal, accounting and fiscal expenses, printing, engraving, advertising and similar expenses, administrative and clerical costs, bond insurance premiums, if any, and other necessary miscellaneous expenses incurred in connection with the issuance and sale of the Notes. The remaining monies in the Note Fund shall be solely used by the County to pay costs of the Project and, if applicable, to reimburse the County for any funds previously expended for Project costs. Moneys in the Note Fund shall be invested at the direction of the County Trustee in such investments as shall be permitted by applicable law. Earnings from such investments shall be deposited by the County Trustee in the Note Fund to pay costs of the Projects or to the County's debt service fund to pay principal and interest on the Notes at the direction of the Finance Director. Funds remaining in the Note Fund after payment of costs of issuance, completion of the Projects and reimbursement to the County for funds previously expended for Project costs, if any, shall be transferred to the County's debt service to be used to pay principal and interest on the Notes.

In accordance with state law, the various department heads responsible for the fund or funds receiving and disbursing funds are hereby authorized to amend the budget of the proper fund or funds for the receipt of proceeds from the issuance of the obligations authorized by this resolution including bond and note proceeds, accrued interest, reoffering premium and other receipts from this transaction. The department heads responsible for the fund or funds are further authorized to amend the proper budgets to reflect the appropriations and expenditures of the receipts authorized by this resolution.

Section 11. Federal Tax Matters Related to the Notes. The County recognizes that the purchasers and holders of the Notes will have accepted them on, and paid therefor a price that reflects, the understanding that interest thereon is excluded from gross income for purposes of federal income taxation under laws in force on the date of delivery of the Notes. Accordingly, the County agrees that it shall take no action that may render the interest on any of said Notes subject to federal income taxation. It is the reasonable expectation of the Governing Body that the proceeds of the Notes will not be used in a manner which will cause the Notes to be "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of Section 148(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), including any lawful regulations promulgated or proposed thereunder, and to this end the said proceeds of the Notes and other related funds established for the purposes herein set out, shall be used and spent expeditiously for the purposes described herein. The Governing Body further covenants and represents that in the event it shall be required by Section 148(f) of the Code to pay any investment proceeds of the Notes to the United States government, it will make such payments as and when required by said Section and will take such other actions as shall be necessary or permitted to prevent the interest on the Notes from becoming subject to inclusion in the gross income for purposes of federal income taxation. The County Mayor and the Director of Finance are authorized and directed to make such certifications in this regard in connection with the sale of the Notes as any or all shall deem appropriate, and such certifications shall constitute a representation and certification of the County. Following the issuance of the Notes, the Director of Accounts and Budgets is directed to administer the County's Federal Tax Compliance Policies and Procedures with respect to the Notes.

Section 12. Discharge and Satisfaction of Notes. If the County shall pay and discharge the indebtedness evidenced by any of the Notes in any one or more of the following ways:

- (a) By paying or causing to be paid, by deposit of sufficient funds as and when required with the Registration Agent, the principal of and interest on such Notes as and when the same become due and payable;
- (b) By depositing or causing to be deposited with any trust company or bank whose deposits are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation and which has trust powers ("a Trustee"), in trust, on or before the date of maturity, sufficient money or Federal Obligations, the principal of and interest on which, when due and payable, will provide sufficient moneys to pay such Notes and to pay interest thereon when due until the maturity date;
- (c) By delivering such Notes to the Registration Agent, for cancellation by it; and if the County shall also pay or cause to be paid all other sums payable hereunder by the County with respect to such Notes, or make adequate provision therefor, and by resolution of the Governing Body instruct any such Trustee to pay amounts when and as required to the Registration Agent for the payment of principal of and interest on such Notes when due, then and in that case the indebtedness evidenced by such Notes shall be discharged and satisfied and all covenants, agreements and obligations of the County to the owners of such Notes shall be fully discharged and satisfied and shall thereupon cease, terminate and become void.

If the County shall pay and discharge the indebtedness evidenced by any of the Notes in the manner provided in either clause (a) or clause (b) above, then the registered owners thereof shall thereafter be entitled only to payment out of the money or Federal Obligations deposited as aforesaid.

Except as otherwise provided in this Section, neither Federal Obligations nor moneys deposited with the Registration Agent pursuant to this Section nor principal or interest payments on any such Federal Obligations shall be withdrawn or used for any purpose other than, and shall be held in trust for, the payment of the principal and premium, if any, and interest on said Notes; provided that any cash received from such principal or interest payments on such Federal Obligations deposited with the Registration Agent, (A) to the extent such cash will not be required at any time for such purpose, shall be paid over to the County as received by the Registration Agent and (B) to the extent such cash will be required for such purpose at a later date, shall, to the extent practicable, be reinvested in Federal Obligations maturing at times and in amounts sufficient to pay when due the principal and interest to become due on said Notes and interest earned from such reinvestments shall be paid over to the County, as received by the Registration Agent. For the purposes of this Section, Federal Obligations shall mean direct obligations of, or obligations, the principal of and interest on which are guaranteed by, the United States of America, which bonds or other obligations shall not be subject to redemption prior to their maturity other than at the option of the registered owner thereof.

- Section 13. Reimbursement. It is reasonably expected that the County will reimburse itself for certain expenditures made by it in connection with the Project by issuing the Notes. This resolution shall be placed in the minutes of the Governing Body and shall be made available for inspection by the general public at the office of the Governing Body. This resolution constitutes a declaration of official intent under Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.
- Section 14. Qualified <u>Tax-Exempt Obligations</u>. The Governing Body hereby authorizes the County Mayor to designate the Notes as "qualified tax-exempt obligations", to the extent the Notes, or any emission thereof, may be designated, within the meaning of and pursuant to Section 265 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.
- Section 15. Reasonably Expected Economic Life. The "reasonably expected economic life" of the Project within the meaning of Section 9-21-101 et seq., Tennessee Code Annotated, is greater than twenty (20) years.
- Section 16. Resolution a Contract. The provisions of this resolution shall constitute a contract between the County and the registered owners of the Notes, and after the issuance of the Notes, no change, variation or alteration of any kind in the provisions of this resolution shall be made in any manner until such time as the Notes and interest due thereon shall have been paid in full.
- Section 17. Separability. If any section, paragraph or provision of this resolution shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this resolution.
- <u>Section</u> 18. <u>Repeal of Conflicting Resolutions and Effective Date</u>. All other resolutions and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this resolution are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed and this resolution shall be in immediate effect from and after its adoption.

WHEREAS, county governments have been fiscally disciplined which allows Tennessee to remain a low property tax burden state; however, county budgets are increasingly strained by factors out of its control; and

WHEREAS, many counties are experiencing rapid population growth as families are choosing to move to Tennessee and live in its communities which adds to the demand for county services and infrastructure which are necessary to maintain the quality of life all Tennesseans deserve; and







Franklin County, TN Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILOT) Program

Introduction

The Franklin County, TN Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILOT) Program is designed to attract and retain businesses that contribute to economic growth, job creation, and community investment. This incentive program provides temporary tax relief to qualifying businesses in exchange for commitments to invest in the local economy.

Objectives

The PILOT Program aims to:

- Encourage new business development and attract investment.
- Retain and expand existing businesses in Franklin County.
- Promote job creation and workforce development.
- Increase the county's tax base over the long term.
- Support strategic industries and infrastructure improvements.

Eligibility Criteria

To qualify for the PILOT Program, businesses must meet at a minimum point requirement based on a combination of capital investment, job creation and starting salary.

Program Benefits

Eligible businesses may receive the following benefit:

- A tiered tax abatement structure based on job creation and investment levels to provide a
 Graduated tax reduction starting at 80% and decreasing incrementally.
 - Level One Plan 3 Year PILOT
 - Level Two Plan 4 Year PILOT
 - Level Three Plan 5 Year PILOT
 - Level Four Plan 10 Year PILOT

Application & Approval Process

- 1. Preliminary Consultation Businesses meet with the Franklin County Industrial Economic Development Director to discuss project scope and eligibility.
- 2. Formal Application Submission Applicants provide detailed plans, investment projections, and job creation commitments.
- 3. Evaluation & Review The IDB reviews applications based on economic impact, industry relevance, and compliance with county goals.
- 4. Approval & Agreement Execution Approved applicants enter into a PILOT agreement outlining tax benefits, compliance requirements, and reporting obligations.
- 5. Annual Performance Review Businesses submit annual reports verifying compliance, investment progress, and job creation metrics.

Compliance & Clawback Provisions

To ensure accountability, the PILOT Program includes:

- Annual reporting requirements on investment, job creation, and community impact.
- Clawback provisions requiring repayment of tax savings if performance benchmarks are not met.
- · Periodic review to assess continued eligibility and compliance.

Conclusion

The Franklin County PILOT Program is a strategic initiative to stimulate economic development, attract high-value businesses, and enhance community prosperity. By providing targeted tax incentives, Franklin County aims to create a thriving business environment while ensuring long-term economic sustainability.

Some new projects and expansions may have extraordinary circumstances and the board reserves the right to modify these plans to fit those circumstances. Modifications will be subject to commission/council approval.

Companies would be given three years to meet the job and wage requirements on which the PILOT agreement is based. If not met by the end of the third year of the abatement period the abatement would be reduced to the level that conforms to the jobs and wages the company did reach. Previously abated taxes exceeding the new abatement plan level will be due and payable immediately. If the company does not reach the minimum level requirements the taxes would be due and payable at 100% and all abatements would have to be refunded. In addition, once the above requirements are met, the company is expected to maintain the jobs and wages at the level of their PILOT agreement. If at any point thereafter the jobs or wages fall below the required level the PILOT agreement will be modified to conform to the new level.

Average wage would be figured as the average wage for all positions created by the expansion including management positions. The average would be calculated by adding all the hourly wages paid and divided by the number of new positions.

Companies would be required to provide capital investment, wage and job creation data on a semiannual basis as proof of compliance.

Taxes due and payable in the current tax year cannot be abated by a PILOT agreement unless such abatement is approved by the County Commission/City Commission.
